KEY MISSION - ENDURING BASE SUPPORT

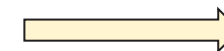

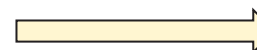

Overview – The Europe District supports EUCOM and AFRICOM theater security plans and all three pillars of U.S. foreign policy:

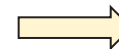
- **Defense**

Typical Projects:

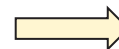
- Construction of facilities for foreign militaries through Foreign Military Sales (FMS)

KEY MISSION - FORWARD BASING AND POSTURE



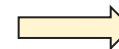
Overview – Europe District supports the forward basing and posture of U.S. and NATO military forces by providing additional infrastructure at host-nation military bases across Europe.

Generally, this program is funded through two main programs:

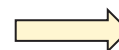
- **EDI, or the U.S. European Deterrence Initiative:** The majority of Forward Basing and Posture projects are funded through the EDI program, by which the U.S. Congress has appropriated funds every year since 2015 in order to deter Russian aggression, assure Allies, and build the capacity of our partners.
- **NSIP, or NATO Security Investment Program:** Projects are also funded through this North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) program, which provides for increased NATO capability to keep Europe free, whole, and at peace.

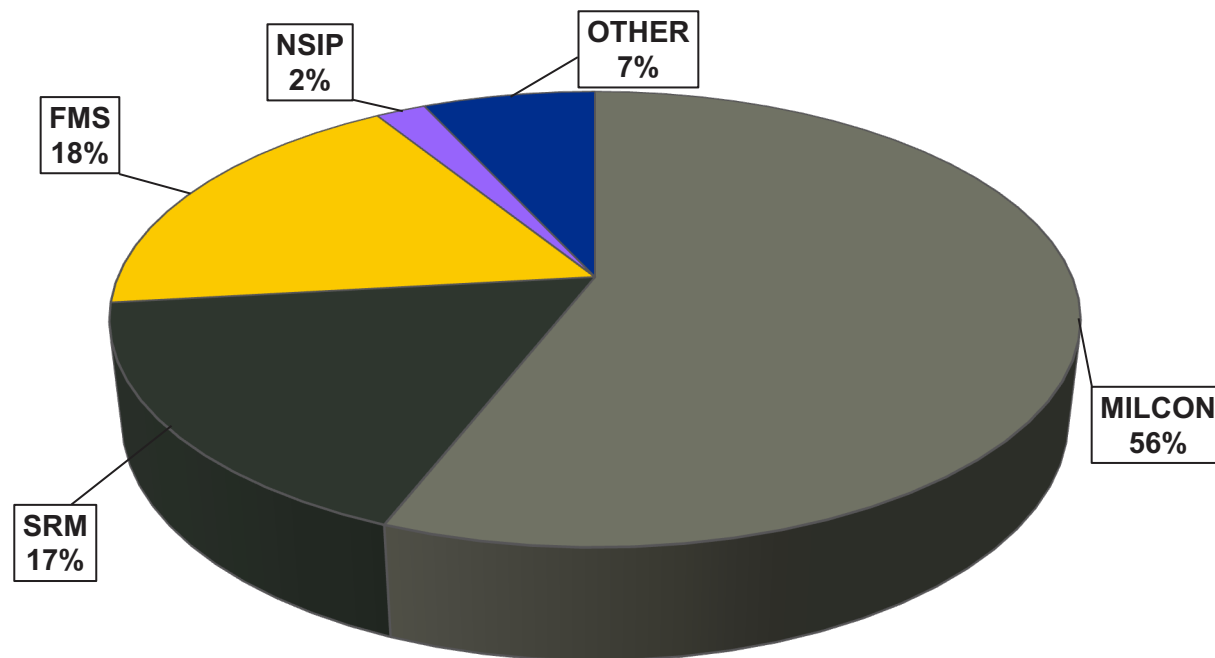
